What is the DSO?



- Developmental Services Ontario (DSO) helps adults with developmental disabilities find ministry funded services and supports in their community.
- There are nine offices located across the province.





The DSO will help you:

- understand and complete the application process.
- determine the kind of services and supports you need.
- get access to MCCSS funded services and supports that you need when a spot is available.
- find **information** in your community.

Call the DSO office in your area to start the application process—you can apply as early as age 16!







Helping people understand individual housing options

Whether individuals already have a vision for where they'd like to live, or need assistance putting it together, a housing navigator can help.





The role of the housing navigator

We seek to provide individuals, families and their support networks with the information and resources needed to create unique and person-centered housing options.







What we do

- Point to resources and organizations that can help create a plan
- Provide a tool kit of resources
- Connect you with family support networks to share information
- Work with housing organizations to find local options and opportunities
- Share success stories of people on a similar journey as you

- A list of services and resources available to families, both ministry and non-ministry funded
- ASSISTANCE Self-assessments and questionnaires to help people decide their housing goals and preferred housing types



The Support Sequence





Personal Strengths and Assets

- This Sequence of Events is a very clear way to discover the gaps and needs of your housing plan
- What strengths does the person have
- What parts do they need help with
- What supports do they already have in place





Assistive Technology

- The use of technology can provide direct support, increases safeguards for the person and may reduce overall costs
- Using smart technology (Google home, Alexa, etc.) can support reminders
- Consider using a smart home alarm system for fire, flooding (faucets kept on)
- Apps, e-learning and video taping routines can support learning & staff training
- Technology initiative with the north/north east region





Natural Supports

- These are unpaid people in your life
- They may include family and friends
- They sometimes include people who used to be formal supports (for example a former teacher), who have become friends over time
- They could be neighbours, family friends, community members, classmates, etc.





Formal Supports

- These are people who have a paid relationship with you, either through government funded resources or private funds
- They might be support staff from a local agency, your swimming instructor, a teacher, etc.





MCCSS Funded Services and Supports

- Residential Services and Supports
- Community Participation Supports
- Passport Funding
- Caregiver Respite
- Person Directed Planning (PDP)
- Adult Protective Service Workers (APSW)
- Specialized Supports





Self Funded Supports

- ODSP for rent and basic needs. Also dietary and employment allowance, if applicable
- Henson Trusts –families can leave assets to an individual
- Registered Disability Savings Plan RDSP
 - For every \$1 put in an RDSP account, the federal government can (if your family income is below \$91,831) match with up to \$3
- Grants, fundraising, employment, loans and mortgages, life insurance





Survey of DS Sector partners and families


- 418 responses were received over a three week period

What is the age of the person who is planning or who you are supporting in their planning?








Survey of DS Sector partners and families

- Creative employment and micro enterprising
