Who Created Black History Month?

It all began with historian Carter G. Woodson, who began what he called Negro History Week in February of 1926. He was a driven and passionate person who believed that all children should be educated about African American history. Woodson's entire purpose was to educate and highlight African American culture, and also to fight for equality through the positive celebration of black heroes. Celebrations of Black history began in Canada also shortly thereafter.

Why is Black History Month in February?

The reason why he chose February was because the second week of February was

birthday to both President Abraham Lincoln, and abolitionist Frederick Douglass. Along with Woodson's work to create a week to celebrate black history, the 1920's brought with it a heightened interest in black culture, such as was seen in the Harlem Renaissance. In combination with movements throughout the United States, the idea of taking a period of time to celebrate black history began to catch on in many communities.

When Did Black History Month Become Official?

Afterwards, some communities adopted the entire month of February as an unofficial Black History Month, but it wasn't until 1976 when President Gerald Ford recognized it and encouraged Americans to participate in a month-long observance.

In December 1995, the House of Commons officially recognized February as Black History Month in Canada following a motion introduced by the first Black Canadian woman elected to Parliament, the Honourable Jean Augustine. The motion was carried unanimously by the House of Commons.
