

#### LGBTQ is an acronym


meant to encompass a whole bunch of diverse **sexualities** and **genders**. Folks often refer to the Q (standing for "queer"\*) as an **umbrella term**, under which live a whole bunch of identities. This is helpful because **lesbian**, **gay**, and **bisexual** aren't the only marginalized sexualities, and **transgender\*** isn't the only gender identity. In fact, there are many more of both!



\* The "Q" sometimes stands for "questioning" and "transgender" is often thought of as an umbrella term itself (sometimes abbreviated "trans"; or "trans\*" in writing). Lots of asterisks, lots of exceptions, because hey – we're talking about **lots** of different folks with different lived experiences to be inclusive of.



### The Pride Progress Flag



The **flags** five horizontal-coloured stripes represent the diversity of gender fluidity, genderfluid identity, and the genderfluid community. Genderfluid people may also identify as a part of the non-binary community, transgender community, or as multigender.

In 2018, <u>Daniel Quasar</u> designed the Progress Flag as a symbol for the community which features black and brown stripes to represent people of colour, and baby blue, pink and white to include the trans flag in its design. Three Dimensions of Sexual Orientation

Sexual Identity: how you label your sexual orientation


Sexual behaviour: what you do sexually with others

## The Gender Unicorn

**CIS- Gender-** The gender that you were assigned at birth corresponds with their sex.

**Trans- Gender-** people who have a gender identity or gender expression that differs from their sex assigned at birth



Non-binary-or genderqueer is a spectrum of gender identities that are not exclusively masculine or feminine. Nonbinary

Nonbinary is an umbrella term that covers every gender identity outside of the binary (man & woman).

Some genders under Nonbinary are: Genderfluid, Genderqueer, Genderflux, Bigender, Pangender, Polygender, Demiboy, Demigirl,

 Autigender, Agender, Neutrois, Greygender, Maverique, Two-Spirit, and sometimes people just want to be called Nonbinary or Queer.


a-	romantic sexual	does not experience attraction towards

hetero-	romantic sexual	experiences attraction towards gender(s) other than their own.
homo-	romantic sexual	experiences attraction towards the same gender as their own.
bi-	romantic sexual	experiences attraction towards the same gender as well as to other gender(s) than their own.
pan-	romantic sexual	experiences attraction towards all genders / regardless of gender.
poly-	romantic sexual	experiences attraction towards multiple (but not necessarily all) genders.



#### What is Vogue?





## Gender pronouns sets a tone of allyship

Never assume a person's pronouns

Asking and correctly using someone's preferred pronoun is one of the most basic ways to show your respect for their gender identity.

Introduce yourself with your own pronouns
