



### **About Chinese New Years**

The date of the Chinese New Year is determined by the lunar calendar: the holiday falls on the second new moon after the winter solstice on December 21. Thus, each time the New Year in China falls on different dates of the usual Gregorian calendar, between January 21 and February 20.



The festival has a history of over 3,000 years. Celebrations on

lunar New Year's Day can be dated back to the ancient worship of heaven and earth. Over the centuries new traditions were added and celebrations became more entertainment-orientated.

The main Chinese New Year activities include:

- Putting up Decorations Red is the main colour for the festival, as red is believed to be an auspicious colour. Red Chinese lanterns hang in streets; red couplets are pasted on doors; banks and official buildings are decorated with red New Year pictures depicting images of prosperity.
- 2) **Eating Reunion Dinner with Family on New Year's Eve** This is a time for families to be together. People are expected to be home to celebrate the festival with their families. It is believed to be the most important meal of the year. Families watch the Spring Festival Gala, one of the most watched TV shows in China.
- Firecrackers and Fireworks From public displays in major cities to millions of private celebrations in China's rural areas, setting off firecrackers and fireworks is an indispensable festivity.
- 4) Giving Red Envelopes and Other Gifts It's a gesture of goodwill, expressed through the exchange of red envelopes, that builds relationships among family and friends. A Chinese red envelope (known as *lai see* in Cantonese and *hong bao* in Mandarin) is simply an ornate red pocket of paper the size of an index card. They're commonly decorated with beautiful Chinese calligraphy and symbols conveying good luck and prosperity on the recipient. Though they're unquestionably a symbol associated with Chinese New Year, red envelopes are also given for weddings, birthdays and other special occasions.






