TIME

This is an all-day event. You can stay for the whole event day or enjoy for an hour. It is up to you!

MATERIALS

- Required: Admission(Free)
- Required: Toronto Dragon Boat festival only, Ferry (\$8.50+ per adult. Approx.)
- Optional: Parking (free to \$40.00+approx.depending on location)
- Optional: Public Transit (\$3.25+per fare, depending on city)
- Optional: Spending money for food (\$10+ approx.)
- Optional: Spending money for merchandise (\$10+ approx.)
- Optional: raincoat/Umbrella (\$20.00+approx.)
- Optional: Pack your own lunch/snacks/drinks (\$10.00+ approx.)
- Optional: camera/video recording (\$200+approx.)
- Optional: foldable/portable chairs (\$35.00+approx.)

Note: You can also purchase day public transit passes for the city you are visiting. Prices vary. See resource section for fare rates by city.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Plan a day/time for this activity to take place. Keep in mind they race rain or shine.
- 2. Invite your friends, family, and acquaintances.

3. Decide how you will get to the event: car, ferry, taxi/uber, public transit and plan your travel to and from the event. Purchase ferry tickets in advance online.

- 4. Save and bring money for purchasing any food or merchandise at the event, if desired.
- 5. Mark the date and time of the event in your calendar.
- 6. Send reminders to your group the day before to remind them of the event.
- 7. Pack any food/drinks/snacks with you and bring to the event if you don't want to purchase it there.
- 8. Pack and dress for the weather, be prepared. 9. Attend the event and have fun.

OTHER THINGS TO NOTE:
