Program Highlights

The Community Integration through Co-operative Education (CICE) program is a two year certificate program designed for adults with developmental disabilities, intellectual disabilities, acquired brain injury or other significant learning challenges who wish to further their education/vocational training in a community college setting.

As a student, you will have the opportunity to complete an individualized CICE program of study including courses from an area of interest selected from St. Lawrence College's program offerings. Your choice may be dependent on seat availability and program suitability. Course work will provide you with opportunities to develop and enhance your academic skills. Through field placement experiences arranged by CICE program staff, you will develop or refine your abilities in a number of potential work environments. Students can expect to be visited on their placements by our Faculty Advisors periodically throughout each semester.

CICE students are offered supports, such as curriculum modification, note taking, tutoring, and other related academic services as needed. Upon successful completion

• pursue personal areas of academic/vocational interest of all courses and the field placement requirements, you will graduate with an Ontario College Certificate in CICE. Students will receive course summaries from each successfully completed course.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Students graduating from the CICE program will be better prepared for a variety of entry-level jobs and volunteer opportunities. As well, some students may choose to enter other college programs after completing the CICE program, if admission requirements are met.

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ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), Ontario Secondary School Certificate (OSSC), or be at least 19 years of age by the start of classes and submit a complete application, which demonstrates:

- academic needs that require curriculum modification in order to succeed;
- the ability to provide his or her own transportation to and from the college and field placement locations;
- a level of independence which does not require constant supervision; and,
- a willingness to participate fully in the program.

STAGES OF THE APPLICATION **AND SELECTION PROCESS**

Please note: Application packages received after the deadline will be placed on a waiting list depending on eligibility.

STAGE ONE

- Attend an information session: see program webpage for full details.
- Fill out an Ontario Colleges application form online at www.ontariocolleges.ca by February 1st for equal consideration.
- Complete and submit the CICE Application Package, found at www.stlawrencecollege.ca/programs then search "CICE". Return by email to CICE@sl.on.ca by February 15th for equal consideration.
- · As part of the application package, provide a confidential reference that has been completed and submitted by an individual who has extensive knowledge of the applicant in an academic or vocational setting (family members excluded). The Confidential Reference can be found in the CICE Application package.

STAGE TWO

· Attend a personal interview and skills assessment once notified by the Program Liaison.

STAGE THREE

• Once accepted, students may need to obtain a current Criminal Background Check just prior to November or the first year of study and may need to submit a completed Placement Immunization Form.

STAGE FOUR

· Attend the CICE Student Orientation before semester start-up.
