INSTRUCTIONS

1. Go to <https://www.storyboardthat.com/> on your internet connected device
2. Make an account by pressing on the big blue button on the top righthand side of the screen with the word Register inside of it and fill out all the criteria that is required
3. Then decide on a free trail or purchase a plan (details on the plans will be listed below)
4. Then log back onto the website, press Create a Storyboard and follow the training prompts to find out how to use the websites and features.
5. Make your own Comic book and save your work frequently.
6. Print out finished work in order to make a real comic book
