Communication Exercise



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WHAT MAKES IT MEANINGFUL

This communication exercise helps groups mindfully describe instructions to each other. It does not require each person to be an amazing artist, rather it tries to focus on the differences of each caricature.

TIME

This activity should take about 30 minutes to an hour depending on how many people are participating.

MATERIALS

- Paper
- Pencil or pen
- Internet access



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Each person should think of a mythological creature to draw. Do not tell the other person what it is. It can be a unicorn, a chimera, the options are endless.
- 2. Once done, decide who is the drawer and who is describing the creature.
- 3. The person describing must instruct the other person how to draw their creature as accurately as possible for 10 minutes.
- 4. Once done, take some time to go through what each person has drawn.
- 5. Switch members till everyone has had a turn.
