OVERVIEW

The CICE program is for students with developmental disabilities, intellectual disabilities, acquired brain injury, or other significant learning challenges and who:

- Want to experience college
- Want to develop both academic and workforce skills

PROGRAM COMPONENTS

- Take courses in two or more elective areas (e.g. Culinary, Carpentry, Fine Arts - Visual & Creative Arts, Vet Assistant, Early Childhood Education, etc.)
- Develop learning strategies and employability skills in core CICE courses
- Apply and practice employability skills in a variety of work placements

PROGRAM GOALS

- Full participation in college and campus life
- Vocational and academic skill building
- Social and communication skills
- Friendships and social networks
- Job skills
- Build independence

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Be better prepared for a variety of entry-level jobs and volunteer opportunities.



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SUPPORTS

Students in the CICE program receive the following supports:

- Individualized support from Learning Specialist for classroom participation, tests, and assignments
- Course modifications
- Tutoring and other related academic services as needed
- Support with assignments and tests

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applications received by February 1, 2024 will be given first consideration. Applications will continue to be accepted after this date, however, until the program is full. In order to meet the criteria of a successful application, the following supporting documents are required:

- Ontario Secondary School Certificate (OSSC) or an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or a Certificate of Accomplishment, equivalent, or mature student
- Demonstration of academic needs that require curriculum modification in order to succeed (i.e. Individual Education Plan (IEP), Annual Education Plan (AEP), Psychological Educational Assessment, or other supporting documentation)
- Two confidential references

PROGRAM CONTACTS

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As the selection process unfolds, applicants should also be able to meet the following preliminary criteria:

- Attend an information session
- Demonstrate a level of independence which does not require constant support and supervision
- Have a willingness to participate fully in the program in all elements of programming
- Ability to participate in programming without risk to health and safety of self and others
- Ability to provide transportation to and from the college and field placement locations
- Participate in an individual application intake process to determine program suitability, including an interview and skills assessment
- Criteria to be considered during the intake process, but not limited to: communication skills, independence, self-motivation, and digital skills.
- Additional meetings may be required to assess unique individual needs.
