



Silent Scenario Showdown

Drama

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WHAT MAKES IT MEANINGFUL

This fun activity allows participants to utilize their creativity. Additionally, Drama is an important way to express ourselves and act out different roles that we can take on in our everyday life. Drama provides a way for us to express emotions and take on different roles that help us to understand how others might respond. Drama is a way for us to engage with others and interact in meaningful ways on different levels.

TIME

This activity can take as little as 30 minutes or as much as 1 hour depending on how long the game plays out for.

MATERIALS

- At least 20 strips of paper (8" x 11" paper cut into multiple strips)
- Scissors
- 2 mason jars
- Props (such as, wigs, hats, etc.)

INSTRUCTIONS

This game works best in a group (minimum 5 people)

1. Write down random, funny scenarios on strips of paper (at least 10) and place them in a mason jar.
2. Write down the props you have available on different strips of paper and place them in the second mason jar.
3. One at a time each person will pick one strip from the scenario mason jar and another from prop mason jar.
4. Using the prop, act out the scenario you picked out in under 2 minutes without making any sounds.



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5. The rest of the group will try and guess what your scenario is.
6. Once the time has come to a finish (whether or not the rest of the group guessed their scenario) the next person will complete their turn.
7. The game finishes once everyone has gone or when the group collectively agrees to end the game.

Supports may be needed to write down ideas/props. If needed further assistance may be required when cutting the strips of paper and when picking the strips of paper from the mason jars.
