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WHAT MAKES IT MEANINGFUL

A Virtual Scavenger Hunt is meaningful because it fosters connection and creativity in a fun, inclusive way. By encouraging participants to explore their surroundings and share personal items, the game helps build relationships and promotes a sense of achievement. It's an accessible activity that brings joy, stimulates curiosity, and allows everyone to feel valued and included, making it a memorable and positive experience for all involved.

TIME

15+ minute set up. Unlimited play.

MATERIALS

- A list of items or clues (you can create your own or use the examples below)
- A device with a camera (like a phone, tablet, or computer) for the video call
- OR play in person
- A group of friends or family members to play with

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Set Up the Video Call (optional): Choose a video call platform everyone is comfortable with (like Zoom, Google Meet, or Skype). Send out the meeting link to everyone who's playing. Make sure everyone's camera and microphone are working.
- 2. Explain the Rules: Tell everyone that you'll be giving clues or naming items, and they'll need to find something in their home that matches. The first person to find the item and show it on camera wins that round. Keep it light and fun—everyone's a winner just by playing!
- 3. Start the Hunt: Read out the first clue or item. For example: "Find something red!" "Find a spoon!" "Find something that makes you happy!" Give participants a few minutes to find the item and bring it back to the camera.
- 4. Show and Tell: When someone finds the item, they should hold it up to the camera and say what it is. You can have a little "show and tell" moment where everyone shares why they picked that item. Feel free to award points or just keep playing for fun!
- 5. Move to the Next Item: Once everyone has shared, move on to the next clue or item. Repeat steps 3 and 4 until you've gone through all the items on your list.
- 6. At the end of the hunt, celebrate everyone's creativity and participation. You can even have a virtual round of applause or give out virtual badges (like "Fastest Finder" or "Most Creative Item").

- Find something that starts with the letter "B."
- Find something that makes noise.

Mix up the clues to include colors, shapes, feelings, and even silly challenges (like finding something that makes a funny noise). Encourage creativity—there's no "wrong" answer!
