# Water Bottle Fireworks Crafts



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# WHAT MAKES IT MEANINGFUL

This recycled craft turns ordinary plastic bottles into dazzling, illuminated "fireworks." It enhances fine motor skills, creativity, and sensory engagement. Plus, it's eco-friendly—reusing materials and providing a simple science/art experience

• 15–20 minutes for assembly and decorating

# MATERIALS

- Clean, empty plastic water bottle (500 ml works well)
- Metallic confetti or sequins
- Metallic star shaped stickers
- LED balloon lights (small battery-powered light that fits in bottle cap)
- Scissors (adult supervision)
- Hot glue (low-temperature) or glue tape
- Optional: paper cut-outs of different shapes, ribbon, paint for additional decoration



# Water Bottle Fireworks

### INSTRUCTIONS

#### 1. Prep the bottle

• Peel off any labels and trim off the top 2" of the bottle.

#### 2. Create firework strands

 Make vertical cuts about <sup>1</sup>/<sub>8</sub> of an inch wide all around the top (cap end), creating "fringe."

#### 3. Fluff & shape

• Bend and fan out the cut strips to resemble fireworks bursting.

#### 4. Decorate strand ends

- Secure a dot of hot glue or glue tape to a piece of confetti/sequin
- Attach it to the end of each plastic strip
- Alternatively, you can add star shaped stickers to the ends, to create star fireworks
  - i. You can also combine different decorations in the same firework!

#### 5. Insert LED light

• Drop LED balloon light into the cap area to illuminate from within.

#### 6. Enjoy & display

- Turn lights off, switch on the LED, and watch the bottle sparkle like a glowing firework!
- 7. Repeat
  - Make as many additional "fireworks" as you want. Be creative and experiment with different designs to see which one you like best!

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# SUPPORTS NEEDED

- Visual step-by-step guide with photos/models
- One-on-one help for cutting and gluing steps
- Pre-cut strands or pre-attached confetti for simpler prep
- Sensory accommodations: gloves if materials feel rough
- Safety supervision for scissors and hot glue
- Verbal prompts: "Now fluff the strands," "Add confetti to each tip"
- Praise and encouragement during each step
- Clean-up support: ensure scissors/glue stored safely and workspace tidied
