

# Animal of the Day

## WHAT MAKES IT MEANINGFUL

This activity connects people to animals and nature in creative ways. Participants explore different animals through crafts, sounds, stories, history, and games.

## TIME

- 1-2 hours

## MATERIALS

- Animal photos or videos (free)
- Art supplies (paint, markers, paper - \$10–\$15)
- Animal sounds (YouTube)
- Toys or stuffed animals (optional - \$5 per animal)
- Nature items (leaves, feathers, sand, etc – free)
- Books (Library)

## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Choose an animal of the day (elephant, cats, birds, etc)
2. Show pictures and videos and talk about everything about them (where they live, what they eat, what makes them special, etc)



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3. Play the sounds the specific animal makes and let them guess or copy the sound if they want to.
4. Make a craft related to that animal (masks, colouring papers, painting, etc)
5. Read a short story
