Interviewing the Provider:

1. What training and experience have you had working with children?

2. What kinds of activities do you like to do with the children? (*The answer will give you an idea of what your child will do during the day.*)

3. What would you do in an emergency? (*Ask specific questions, such as "What would you do if a child had an allergic reaction?"*)

4. Do you transport children to special activities in your car? (*If so, ask about insurance and car seats.*)

5. Do you have any pets? Is the pet's area away from the child's play area?

6. Will there be other children and adults in your home while you are caring for my child? (*If the answer is "Yes", ask to meet the other children and adults, and make sure you are comfortable about your child being with them.*)

The Program: 1. What are the sleeping arrangements during nap time?

2. Do you, weather permitting, provide opportunities for outdoor play or fresh air?

Note for Parents: Take a minute to look at the toys and games. Are there enough? Is there a variety? Are they clean, in good repair and suited to the age and interests of your child? Check to see that the equipment and furniture are clean and in good repair.

Health, Safety and Nutrition:
